## What's Happening?

- Received information on April 26th from Kristin Dean, project manager at Norris Designs for proposed RV storage area at 6800 Kilmer Street Landfill
  - current owner, Chelton, LLC, is going forward with proposed plans for a RV storage lot
    - project scaled down in size of area--number of parking spaces TBD
    - located 240 feet from Croke Canal
    - no indoor storage areas
    - plan to submit application to the City of Arvada and for Voluntary CleanUp Plan (VCUP) to Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE)
    - will host public meeting for adjacent neighborhoods and interested neighbors as required by CDPHE
- City of Arvada
  - as of 04/26, City Planners have not been contacted by developer/land owner (Chelton) or Norris Designs
  - $\circ$   $\,$  original application for proposed RV storage area from 2021 is void
  - developer will start a new application process for a proposed RV storage lot
  - reminder: original application did not require public meeting per City application process; due to community concerns, first developer held a public meeting at City Hall after application for proposed RV storage lot was approved by City and public notice sent to adjacent communities
- Trust for Public Land
  - cannot assist us at this time
  - recommends transfer from private land ownership to public ownership (county or city)

## What's Next?

- Plan for public meeting
  - when details of meeting available, we will inform residents of Forest Springs, Geos, and Westwoods Mesa communities
  - we need as many supporters from adjacent communities as well as Ralston Trail walkers to attend a public meeting when one is scheduled
  - FRCN's focus is to:
    - hinder the resurgence of the proposed RV storage lot with an outpour of comments and overwhelming public attendance at general meeting
    - promote environmentally responsible re-development of the landfill area without incurring additional legal fees
  - unknown City pre-application process or type of City Planning application
  - FRCN is on record with the City for environmentally responsible re-development of the unregulated landfill

As the song goes, "it's not over 'til it's over---we can't let this get away"! ----- different subject but same message!

We received comments to share information and we will continue with Updates.
